## **ACLCF Endorsements**

The Australian Council of the Laity of the Chevalier Family endorses the Uluru Statement from the Heart (an invitation from the First Nations people of Australia to dialogue about human dignity, inclusion, a parliamentary voice, treaty, and truth), Laudato Si (an encyclical letter exploring the relationship between God, people, and the Earth and discussing our responsibility to care for Creation and others), and the supporting <u>Declaration</u> endorsed by the lay and professed branches of the Chevalier Family. The following logos and brief statements have been added to the ACLCF email signature, official documents, and website (coming soon) to demonstrate these endorsements.

#### Uluru Statement From The Heart

We commit to a "greater love for our Creator, each other, and the home we share". (Laudato Si 14).


We live in the Spirituality of the Heart and are called to love and care for Creation.

## **Spiritual Companion**

The Australian Council of the Laity of the Chevalier Family is pleased to announce that Michael Fallon, Missionary of the Sacred Heart (MSC), has accepted the position of Spiritual Companion.

The Spiritual Companion offers formation and guidance to the members of the Australian Council, particularly in *Spirituality* of the Heart and its practical implications. ## Vision for the Future

The Synod on Synodality (2021-2024) is a "gathering of the faithful to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church and asking her to be and to do", particularly concerning adopting a synodal Church "led by the Holy Spirit who enables everyone to offer their own contribution to the Church's life" (Synod FAQ). Becoming a synodal Church is an opportunity to become a "listening Church" and a Church of "closeness, compassion and tender love", which better reflects the "style of God" (Pope Francis, 09 October 2021). The Wijngaards Institute for Catholic Research (WICR) has coordinated an interdisciplinary group of academics to work on a proposed new 'Constitution of the Catholic Church' in preparation for the Synod on Synodality (2021-2024). <u>Download the Proposed Constitution</u>.

As the Continental Phase of the Synod begins, there is an opportunity for Australians to contribute feedback about their vision for the future of the Catholic Church. The submissions portal will be open from 4 November to 9 December 2022.


## Laudato Si Film

In October, the Vatican released a Laudato Si film called The Letter, which invites people to explore caring for the natural environment and others.

"In 2015, Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si (The Letter), an encyclical letter about the environmental crisis to every single person in the world. A few years later, four voices that have gone unheard in global conversations have been invited to an unprecedented dialogue with the Pope. Hailing from Senegal, the Amazon, India, and Hawai'i, they bring perspective and solutions from the poor, the indigenous, the youth, and wildlife into a conversation with Pope Francis himself. This documentary follows their journey to Rome and the extraordinary experiences that took place there, and is packed with powerfully moving personal stories alongside the latest information about the planetary crisis and the toll it's taking on nature and people." 
## **Father Linckens Anniversary**

The Chevalier Family commemorated Father Hubert Linckens on 5 October 2022, the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death.

The anniversary event on Saturday, 8 October 2022, was a joy-filled, reverent and reflective occasion that recalled the life of Father Linckens, a great missionary and the founder of the Missionary Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (MSC Sisters).

The Eucharist was led by Father Peter Hendricks MSC and celebrated with the Chevalier Family.

The friendly lunchtime gathering facilitated reconnection with each other, sharing stories and fond memories.





## Father Chevalier Anniversary

The Chevalier Family commemorated the life and vision of Father Jules Chevalier on 21 October 2022, the anniversary of his death.



## Daramalan College Anniversary

The Laity of the Chevalier Family Australia congratulates Daramalan College, a Chevalier Family school, on its 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

"The Headmaster at the time, Fr McMahon MSC, explained to the first Assembly that the name 'Daramalan' came from the local Aboriginal word for 'eagle-men', the eagle being their symbol to indicate the Great Spirit. That same spirit aligns with the 'heart' ethos of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, which has been pivotal in the education of our 17,000 students over the last 60 years."
