Dear Chevalier Family members,

Thank you for your ongoing involvement in the Laity of the Chevalier Family (LCF).

It is inspirational to be part of a group that believes in Jules Chevalier's charism, a Spirituality of the Heart that encourages us to work toward a better world through prayer and action.

One of the goals of the Australian Council of the Laity of the Chevalier Family (ACLCF) is to support the work of the International Council of LCF to develop an Asia/Pacific identity among lay groups.

The International Council is organising the 4th International Assembly of Laity of the Chevalier Family in the Philippines in 2024.

We aim to raise funds to support two people from Pacific countries to attend as well as supporting four delegates from Australia. The funds will assist with airfares and accommodation expenses.

Delegates will bring back wonderful memories and ideas to guide the future development of the LCF.

The estimated cost of attending is \$2,500 per person. Our goal is, therefore, to raise \$15,000.

Should we be fortunate enough to raise more than required, any remaining funds be used to assist the work of the *Australian Council* for things such as outreach projects.
