Jules Chevalier Birthday (15 March 2023)

On this anniversary of our Founder's birth in 1824, we remember that the identity and future of the Chevalier family (MSC, OLSH Sisters, MSC Sisters, Laity of the Chevalier Family, and all who are partners in this mission) depend on we each live and demonstrate Jules Chevalier's charism in our lives. At the heart of this is believing that, in Jesus, God loves us with a human heart – It is what must inspire us in all we do. Jules Chevalier, who went beyond the ordinary theological teachings of his time, passionately believed that God's love was revealed in the way Jesus loved those he encountered – with His heart, the entirety of who He was, full of compassion, acceptance, kindness, forgiveness and love. Jules' meditation and study to discover the depth of this reality that was his passion in life allowed him to, as Hans Kwakman MSC reminds us,

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Discover the Heart of Christ as the centre of the whole of creation and salvation (Jules Chevalier's Charism, 2014).

He saw this way of viewing the Heart of Jesus as the answer to everything and for everyone – priests, religious, and laity. This large family participate in the same mission, with the laity practising a Spirituality of the Heart in their homes, workplaces, and the groups to which they belong. Jules Chevalier strongly believed that the laity, living in this way, would significantly impact the creation of a more just and loving society. As the pressing issues of the society around us – things like the climate crisis, discrimination, inequality, and the flawed structures that can support them – all originate in the hearts of people, it is first and foremost our hearts that need to be healed and converted if these issues are to be resolved.

What a difficult yet privileged mission we share in!
