September gathering at St Mary's Towers, do you have any suggestions for what we might do? Ideas welcomed.


Enough from me, with every blessing and wishing a belated Happy Easter.



Australian Reflection

Australia is one of the world's largest economies and consumer markets. In 2021, it was ranked 12th with a Nominal Gross Domestic Product of A\$2.2 trillion and has 1.7% of the global economy for 0.3% of the world's population (austrade.gov.au).

Quoting Benedict XVI's *Caritas in Veritate*, Pope Francis reminds us that "every purchase is a moral act" (CV66). It's important to be informed, so learn more about the circular economy and case studies in the Australian Government <u>Sustainable Procurement Guide</u> and CSIRO <u>research projects</u>.

<u>Reflect</u> on your purchasing habits and consider what you could change to be more sustainable and ethical. Buy local. Buy items with a long life span and made from sustainable materials - recyclable or biodegradable. Consider whether you need to purchase something. Repair items. Buy second-hand.

History, Heritage, and Heart: New OLSH Educators Gather at Kensington

Several weeks ago, 11 teachers who this year are beginning their education ministry at OLSH Colleges in Sydney, Melbourne, and Adelaide gathered for a day together at OLSH Convent Kensington. The gathering introduced the charism of Jules Chevalier, the beginnings and ongoing development of OLSH education in Australia, and the deep and beautiful meaning of the title given to Mary by Fr Chevalier, 'Our Lady of the Sacred Heart.' It was a fantastic opportunity for the teachers to meet up with others and to begin to appreciate that they are 'standing on the shoulders' of the OLSH educators, OLSH Sisters, and lay people who have come before them. In one of the sessions, several senior students spoke to the group about how they experienced OLSH College as a heart community and how much this meant to them.

May these teachers, who are now new members of the wider Chevalier family, be inspired by the four pillars of OLSH education: being faith-filled, reverencing relationships, pursuing excellence, and touching the hearts of others.
