Last weekend, the Laity of the Chevalier Family (LCF) Australia had its annual gathering at St Mary's Towers, Douglas Park, with 31 people attending. Many Stories* led by the Australia LCF Council.

It was an opportunity to come to a stronger awareness of our role in continuing the work and spirit of Fr Chevalier in our lives in this twenty-first century.
